Tuesday Studies beginning Sept. 14, from 9:00 – 11:00 a.m.

• **Breaking Free** by Beth Moore. Based on Isaiah 61:1-4. This in-depth Bible study draws parallels between the Israelites in captivity and believers in spiritual captivity. Beth uses Scripture to help identify spiritual strongholds in your life and explains that anything that hinders you from the benefits of knowing God is bondage. The 12-session study is led by Ruth Owen in E218. The cost of the workbook is: \$15.20.

• **The Good, the Bad and the Ugly** by Kay Arthur. In this last course of the Kings and Prophets Series, you'll see worsening religious and political conditions in Judah. The final chapters of 2 Kings and 2 Chronicles introduce us to the last kings of Judah - one the best since King David ("the Good"), the other the worst Judah ever had ("the Bad"). The 8-session Precept study is led by Angela Stonkus in E119. The cost of the workbook is: \$16.00.

Jesus said, "My house shall be called a house of prayer." When we look at the Gospel of Luke, we see that the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus while He was praying, that He chose the 12 disciples after a night in prayer, that He was transfigured while He was praying, that the disciples went to bed but Jesus went to pray, and that while He was dying, He was praying. If Jesus, the Son of God, prayed this much, how much more should we be praying?

AHOP Ministry was started in June, 2008, to encourage women to come together and pray. We have lunch from 12:00 until 1:00 and pray from 1:00 until 2:00. Some come only to pray at 1:00. Our time begins with a short devotional, followed by listening to praise and worship music before we pray.
